PART 7, SECTION 1 — HAGGAI CALLS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF GOD'S TEMPLE

HISTORICAL CONTEXT — Construction Begins & Stalls

Ezra 3:1 to 4:5, 4:24 to 5:2 — *Date:* 538-520 BC — Cyrus's decree permitting the Jews to return to their homeland was probably issued in 538 BC (his "first year" was reckoned by the Jews to start with the Jewish new year in March 538 BC, after he conquered Babylon in October 539 BC). It took time for the first Jews to organize and travel back to Israel. They appear to have arrived in 537 BC. The altar in Jerusalem was rebuilt by the first day of the seventh month in the Jews' first year back in Jerusalem (Ezra 3:3, 3:6); the date was September/October 537 BC. The rebuilding of the temple began in the second month of the second year after their return (3:8)—spring of 536 BC—then was halted until about 520 BC, the second year of King Darius of Persia (4:24).

HOSEA'S MESSAGE — The Time to Rebuild Has Come!

Ezra 5:1-2, Haggai 1:1-15a — *Date:* 520 BC — Haggai 1:1-13 dates to August 29, 520 BC (the 1st day of the 6th month of the 2nd year of Persia's King Darius, who ruled 521-486 BC; Haggai 1:1). The rebuilding of the temple had been stalled for 16 years, since about 536 BC. Rebuilding resumed on the 24th day of the 6th month of Darius's 2nd year—September 21, 520 BC (Haggai 1:14-15).
