

OLD TESTAMENT PROPHECIES FULFILLED IN THE TRIALS, DEATH, BURIAL, & RESURRECTION OF JESUS

<i>Old Testament Text</i>	<i>New Testament Text(s)</i>	<i>What was prophesied? How did it come about?</i>
Psalm 2:1-2	Acts 4:24-28	In Pilate, Herod, & some Jewish people (especially the leaders), the nations, peoples, kings, & rulers banded together against the Lord & against his anointed one, Jesus.
Psalm 16:8-11	Acts 2:25-31	
Psalm 22:7-8	Matthew 27:43, Mark 15:29-32, Luke 23:35-37	
Psalm 22:15-18	Matthew 27:35, Mark 15:24, Luke 23:34, John 19:23-24 & 19:28	
Psalm 22:22-31	Matthew 28, Mark 16:1-8	
Psalm 34:20 + Zechariah 12:10	John 19:31-37	
Psalms 35:19 & 69:4	John 15:23-25	
Psalm 40:6-8	Hebrews 10:5-10	The writer of Hebrews takes these words as messianic prophecy foretelling that Jesus would submit himself to God's will by becoming the ultimate sacrifice for sins.
Psalms 41:9-11, 69:4, 69:22-28	John 17:12	Jesus refers to Judas Iscariot, his betrayer, in John 17:12, saying one of his disciples is "doomed to destruction". The scriptures that are fulfilled through Judas's destruction may include these psalms that speak of God's faithful person being betrayed and the betrayer meeting God's punishment.
Psalms 41:9, 55:12-14	Acts 1:16	
Psalm 55:12-21, Isaiah 53:3-8, Zechariah 13:7	Matthew 26:54-56, Mark 14:27 & 14:49	Jesus believed the prophets had foretold that he would be betrayed and arrested en route to his death. He may have been thinking of these passages from Psalms, Isaiah, and Zechariah.
Psalm 69:9	Romans 15:3	Paul's references to insults falling on Jesus reminds us of the insults he bore during his crucifixion (Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23), not to mention at other times during his ministry.

<i>Old Testament Text</i>	<i>New Testament Text(s)</i>	<i>What was prophesied? How did it come about?</i>
Psalm 118:22-23	Matthew 21:42, Mark 12:10-11, Luke 20:17, Acts 4:11	In the New Testament "the stone the builders rejected" is taken to be Jesus, "the son" in the parable of the tenants (Matthew 21:38, Mark 12:6, Luke 20:13), chosen by God but rejected by the authorities. Peter (Acts 4:11) takes "the stone" becoming "the cornerstone" as a prophecy of Jesus' vindication by God via the resurrection.

Isaiah 53:7-8	Acts 8:32-35 (maybe also Matthew 26:24, Mark 14:21)	
Isaiah 53:11-12	Luke 22:37, Romans 1:2-4	
Zechariah 11:12-13 + Jeremiah 9:1-13 & 32:6-9	Matthew 27:9-10
