John 1:7 He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.

John 1:12 But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God,

John 1:50 Jesus answered, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these."

John 2:11 Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

John 2:22 After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

John 2:23 ¶ When he was in Jerusalem during the Passover festival, many believed in his name because they saw the signs that he was doing.

John 2:24 But Jesus on his part would not entrust himself to them, because he knew all people

John 3:12 If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things?

John 3:15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

John 3:16 ¶ "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

John 3:18 Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

John 3:36 Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever disobeys the Son will not see life, but must endure God's wrath.

John 4:21 Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem.

John 4:39 ¶ Many Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me everything I have ever done."

John 4:41 And many more believed because of his word.

John 4:42 They said to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world."

John 4:48 Then Jesus said to him, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe."

John 4:50 Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and started on his way.

John 4:53 The father realized that this was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." So he himself believed, along with his whole household.

John 5:24 Very truly, I tell you, anyone who hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life, and does not come under judgment, but has passed from death to life.

John 5:38 and you do not have his word abiding in you, because you do not believe him whom he has sent.

John 5:44 How can you believe when you accept glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the one who alone is God?

John 5:46 If you believed Moses, you would believe me, for he wrote about me.

John 5:47 But if you do not believe what he wrote, how will you believe what I say?"

John 6:29 Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent."

John 6:30 So they said to him, "What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing?"

John 6:35 ¶ Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

John 6:36 But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe.

John 6:40 This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day."

John 6:47 Very truly, I tell you, whoever believes has eternal life.

John 6:64 But among you there are some who do not believe." For Jesus knew from the first who were the ones that did not believe, and who was the one that would betray him.

John 6:69 We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."

John 7:5 (For not even his brothers believed in him.)

John 7:31 Yet many in the crowd believed in him and were saying, "When the Messiah comes, will he do more signs than this man has done?"

John 7:38 and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'"

John 7:39 Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive; for as yet there was no Spirit, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

John 7:48 Has any one of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him?

John 8:24 I told you that you would die in your sins, for you will die in your sins unless you believe that I am he."

John 8:30 As he was saying these things, many believed in him.

John 8:31 ¶ Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples;

John 8:45 But because I tell the truth, you do not believe me.

John 8:46 Which of you convicts me of sin? If I tell the truth, why do you not believe me?

John 9:18 ¶ The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight

John 9:35 ¶ Jesus heard that they had driven him out, and when he found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"

John 9:36 He answered, "And who is he, sir? Tell me, so that I may believe in him."

John 9:38 He said, "Lord, I believe." And he worshiped him.

John 10:25 Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me;

John 10:26 but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep.

John 10:37 If I am not doing the works of my Father, then do not believe me.

John 10:38 But if I do them, even though you do not believe me, believe the works, so that you may know and understand that the Father is in me and I am in the Father."

John 10:42 And many believed in him there.

John 11:15 For your sake I am glad I was not there, so that you may believe. But let us go to him."

John 11:25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live,

John 11:26 and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

John 11:27 She said to him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world."

John 11:40 Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?"

John 11:42 I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me."

John 11:45 ¶ Many of the Jews therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.

John 11:48 If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and the Romans will come and destroy both our holy place and our nation."

John 12:11 since it was on account of him that many of the Jews were deserting and were believing in Jesus.

John 12:36 While you have the light, believe in the light, so that you may become children of light." ¶ After Jesus had said this, he departed and hid from them.

John 12:37 Although he had performed so many signs in their presence, they did not believe in him.

John 12:38 This was to fulfill the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah: "Lord, who has believed our message, and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"

John 12:39 And so they could not believe, because Isaiah also said,

John 12:42 Nevertheless many, even of the authorities, believed in him. But because of the Pharisees they did not confess it, for fear that they would be put out of the synagogue;

John 12:44 ¶ Then Jesus cried aloud: "Whoever believes in me believes not in me but in him who sent me.

John 12:46 I have come as light into the world, so that everyone who believes in me should not remain in the darkness.

John 13:19 I tell you this now, before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe that I am he.

John 14:1 ¶ "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me.

John 14:10 Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works.

John 14:11 Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves.

John 14:12 Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father.

John 14:29 And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe.

John 16:9 about sin, because they do not believe in me;

John 16:27 for the Father himself loves you, because you have loved me and have believed that I came from God.

John 16:30 Now we know that you know all things, and do not need to have anyone question you; by this we believe that you came from God.”

John 16:31 Jesus answered them, “Do you now believe?”

John 17:8 for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me.

John 17:20 ¶ “I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word,

John 17:21 that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

John 19:35 (He who saw this has testified so that you also may believe. His testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth.)

John 20:8 Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed;

John 20:25 So the other disciples told him, “We have seen the Lord.” But he said to them, “Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.”

John 20:27 Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe."

John 20:29 Jesus said to him, “Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.”

John 20:31 But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

1John 3:23 ¶ And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us.

1John 4:1 ¶ Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God; for many false prophets have gone out into the world.

1John 4:16 So we have known and believe the love that God has for us. ¶ God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them.

1John 5:1 ¶ Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child.

1John 5:5 Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

1John 5:10 Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son.

1John 5:13 ¶ I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

John 1:4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people.

John 3:15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

John 3:16 ¶ “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

John 3:36 Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever disobeys the Son will not see life, but must endure God's wrath.

John 4:10 Jesus answered her, “If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, ‘Give me a drink,’ you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.”

John 4:11 The woman said to him, “Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water?”

John 4:14 but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.”

John 4:36 The reaper is already receiving wages and is gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together.

John 4:47 When he heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went and begged him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death.

John 4:49 The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my little boy dies."

John 4:50 Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and started on his way.

John 4:51 As he was going down, his slaves met him and told him that his child was alive.

John 4:53 The father realized that this was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." So he himself believed, along with his whole household.

John 5:21 Indeed, just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whomever he wishes.

John 5:24 Very truly, I tell you, anyone who hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life, and does not come under judgment, but has passed from death to life.

John 5:25 ¶ "Very truly, I tell you, the hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live.

John 5:26 For just as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son also to have life in himself;

John 5:29 and will come out--those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation.

John 5:39 ¶ "You search the scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that testify on my behalf.

John 5:40 Yet you refuse to come to me to have life.

John 6:27 Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal."

John 6:33 For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

John 6:35 ¶ Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

John 6:40 This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day."

John 6:47 Very truly, I tell you, whoever believes has eternal life.

John 6:48 I am the bread of life.

John 6:49 Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died.

John 6:50 This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die.

John 6:51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

John 6:53 So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.

John 6:54 Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day;

John 6:57 Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me.

John 6:58 This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever."

John 6:63 It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life.

John 6:68 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life.

John 7:38 and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'"

John 8:12 ¶ Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

John 8:21 ¶ Again he said to them, "I am going away, and you will search for me, but you will die in your sin. Where I am going, you cannot come."

John 8:24 I told you that you would die in your sins, for you will die in your sins unless you believe that I am he."

John 8:51 Very truly, I tell you, whoever keeps my word will never see death."

John 8:52 The Jews said to him, "Now we know that you have a demon. Abraham died, and so did the prophets; yet you say, 'Whoever keeps my word will never taste death.'

John 8:53 Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? The prophets also died. Who do you claim to be?"

John 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

John 10:28 I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand.

John 11:4 But when Jesus heard it, he said, "This illness does not lead to death; rather it is for God's glory, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

John 11:13 Jesus, however, had been speaking about his death, but they thought that he was referring merely to sleep.

John 11:14 Then Jesus told them plainly, "Lazarus is dead.

John 11:16 Thomas, who was called the Twin, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go, that we may die with him."

John 11:21 Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.

John 11:25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live,

John 11:26 and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

John 11:32 When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

John 11:37 But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?"

John 11:50 You do not understand that it is better for you to have one man die for the people than to have the whole nation destroyed."

John 11:51 He did not say this on his own, but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus was about to die for the nation,

John 12:24 Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.

John 12:25 Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life.

John 12:33 He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

John 12:50 And I know that his commandment is eternal life. What I speak, therefore, I speak just as the Father has told me."

John 14:6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

John 14:19 In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live.

John 17:2 since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him.

John 17:3 And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.

John 18:14 Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jews that it was better to have one person die for the people.

John 18:32 (This was to fulfill what Jesus had said when he indicated the kind of death he was to die.)

John 19:7 The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has claimed to be the Son of God."

John 20:31 But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

John 21:19 (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, "Follow me."

John 21:23 So the rumor spread in the community that this disciple would not die. Yet Jesus did not say to him that he would not die, but, "If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you?"

Truth (83X) (αληθεια, αληθης, αληθινος, αληθως)

John 1:9 The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

John 1:14 ¶ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

John 1:17 The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

John 1:47 When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he said of him, "Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!"

John 3:21 But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."

John 3:33 Whoever has accepted his testimony has certified this, that God is true.

John 4:18 for you have had five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true!"

John 4:23 But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him.

John 4:24 God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.”

John 4:37 For here the saying holds true, ‘One sows and another reaps.’

John 4:42 They said to the woman, “It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world.”

John 5:31 ¶ “If I testify about myself, my testimony is not true.

John 5:32 There is another who testifies on my behalf, and I know that his testimony to me is true.

John 5:33 You sent messengers to John, and he testified to the truth.

John 6:14 When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, “This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world.”

John 6:32 Then Jesus said to them, “Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven.

John 6:55 for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink.

John 7:18 Those who speak on their own seek their own glory; but the one who seeks the glory of him who sent him is true, and there is nothing false in him.

John 7:26 And here he is, speaking openly, but they say nothing to him! Can it be that the authorities really know that this is the Messiah?

John 7:28 Then Jesus cried out as he was teaching in the temple, “You know me, and you know where I am from. I have not come on my own. But the one who sent me is true, and you do not know him.

John 7:40 ¶ When they heard these words, some in the crowd said, “This is really the prophet.”

John 8:13 Then the Pharisees said to him, “You are testifying on your own behalf; your testimony is not valid.”

John 8:14 Jesus answered, “Even if I testify on my own behalf, my testimony is valid because I know where I have come from and where I am going, but you do not know where I come from or where I am going.

John 8:16 Yet even if I do judge, my judgment is valid; for it is not I alone who judge, but I and the Father who sent me.

John 8:17 In your law it is written that the testimony of two witnesses is valid.

John 8:26 I have much to say about you and much to condemn; but the one who sent me is true, and I declare to the world what I have heard from him.”

John 8:31 ¶ Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, “If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples;

John 8:32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free.”

John 8:40 but now you are trying to kill me, a man who has told you the truth that I heard from God. This is not what Abraham did.

John 8:44 You are from your father the devil, and you choose to do your father's desires. He was a murderer from the beginning and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks according to his own nature, for he is a liar and the father of lies.

John 8:45 But because I tell the truth, you do not believe me.

John 8:46 Which of you convicts me of sin? If I tell the truth, why do you not believe me?

John 10:41 Many came to him, and they were saying, “John performed no sign, but everything that John said about this man was true.”

John 14:6 Jesus said to him, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

John 14:17 This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

John 15:1 ¶ “I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower.

John 15:26 ¶ “When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf.

John 16:7 Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you.

John 16:13 When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come.

John 17:3 And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.

John 17:8 for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me.

John 17:17 Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth.

John 17:19 And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

John 18:37 Pilate asked him, “So you are a king?” Jesus answered, “You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.”

John 18:38 Pilate asked him, "What is truth?" ¶ After he had said this, he went out to the Jews again and told them, "I find no case against him.

John 19:35 (He who saw this has testified so that you also may believe. His testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth.)

John 21:24 ¶ This is the disciple who is testifying to these things and has written them, and we know that his testimony is true.

1John 1:6 If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true;

1John 1:8 If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

1John 2:4 Whoever says, "I have come to know him," but does not obey his commandments, is a liar, and in such a person the truth does not exist;

1John 2:5 but whoever obeys his word, truly in this person the love of God has reached perfection. By this we may be sure that we are in him:

1John 2:8 Yet I am writing you a new commandment that is true in him and in you, because the darkness is passing away and the true light is already shining.

1John 2:21 I write to you, not because you do not know the truth, but because you know it, and you know that no lie comes from the truth.

1John 2:27 As for you, the anointing that you received from him abides in you, and so you do not need anyone to teach you. But as his anointing teaches you about all things, and is true and is not a lie, and just as it has taught you, abide in him.

1John 3:18 ¶ Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action.

1John 3:19 And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him

1John 4:6 We are from God. Whoever knows God listens to us, and whoever is not from God does not listen to us. From this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error.

1John 5:6 ¶ This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

1John 5:20 And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding so that we may know him who is true; and we are in him who is true, in his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life.

2John 1:1 ¶ The elder to the elect lady and her children, whom I love in the truth, and not only I but also all who know the truth,

2John 1:2 because of the truth that abides in us and will be with us forever:

2John 1:3 ¶ Grace, mercy, and peace will be with us from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, in truth and love.

2John 1:4 ¶ I was overjoyed to find some of your children walking in the truth, just as we have been commanded by the Father.

3John 1:1 ¶ The elder to the beloved Gaius, whom I love in truth.

3John 1:3 I was overjoyed when some of the friends arrived and testified to your faithfulness to the truth, namely how you walk in the truth.

3John 1:4 I have no greater joy than this, to hear that my children are walking in the truth.

3John 1:8 Therefore we ought to support such people, so that we may become co-workers with the truth.

3John 1:12 Everyone has testified favorably about Demetrius, and so has the truth itself. We also testify for him, and you know that our testimony is true.

John 1:34 And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

John 1:42 He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

John 1:45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth."

John 1:49 Nathanael replied, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!"

John 1:51 And he said to him, "Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the **Son of Man**."

John 3:17 ¶ “Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

John 1:19 ¶ This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?"

John 2:6 Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons.

John 2:13 ¶ The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

John 2:18 The Jews then said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?"

John 2:20 The Jews then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?"

John 3:1 ¶ Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews.

John 3:22 ¶ After this Jesus and his disciples went into the Judean countryside, and he spent some time there with them and baptized.

John 3:25 ¶ Now a discussion about purification arose between John's disciples and a Jew.

John 4:9 The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?" (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.)

John 4:22 You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews.

John 5:1 ¶ After this there was a festival of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

John 5:10 So the Jews said to the man who had been cured, "It is the sabbath; it is not lawful for you to carry your mat."

John 5:15 The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well.

John 5:16 Therefore the Jews started persecuting Jesus, because he was doing such things on the sabbath.

John 5:18 For this reason the Jews were seeking all the more to kill him, because he was not only breaking the sabbath, but was also calling God his own Father, thereby making himself equal to God.

John 6:4 Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near.

John 6:41 ¶ Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, “I am the bread that came down from heaven.”

John 6:52 ¶ The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?”

John 7:1 ¶ After this Jesus went about in Galilee. He did not wish to go about in Judea because the Jews were looking for an opportunity to kill him.

John 7:2 Now the Jewish festival of Booths was near.

John 7:11 The Jews were looking for him at the festival and saying, “Where is he?”

John 7:13 Yet no one would speak openly about him for fear of the Jews.

John 7:15 The Jews were astonished at it, saying, “How does this man have such learning, when he has never been taught?”

John 7:35 The Jews said to one another, “Where does this man intend to go that we will not find him? Does he intend to go to the Dispersion among the Greeks and teach the Greeks?”

John 8:22 Then the Jews said, “Is he going to kill himself? Is that what he means by saying, ‘Where I am going, you cannot come?’”

John 8:31 ¶ Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, “If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples;

John 8:48 ¶ The Jews answered him, “Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?”

John 8:52 The Jews said to him, “Now we know that you have a demon. Abraham died, and so did the prophets; yet you say, ‘Whoever keeps my word will never taste death.’”

John 8:57 Then the Jews said to him, “You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?”

John 9:18 ¶ The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight

John 9:22 His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews; for the Jews had already agreed that anyone who confessed Jesus to be the Messiah would be put out of the synagogue.

John 10:19 ¶ Again the Jews were divided because of these words.

John 10:24 So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, “How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly.”

John 10:31 ¶ The Jews took up stones again to stone him.

John 10:33 The Jews answered, “It is not for a good work that we are going to stone you, but for blasphemy, because you, though only a human being, are making yourself God.”

John 11:8 The disciples said to him, “Rabbi, the Jews were just now trying to stone you, and are you going there again?”

John 11:19 and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to console them about their brother.

John 11:31 The Jews who were with her in the house, consoling her, saw Mary get up quickly and go out. They followed her because they thought that she was going to the tomb to weep there.

John 11:33 When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved.

John 11:36 So the Jews said, “See how he loved him!”

John 11:45 ¶ Many of the Jews therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.

John 11:54 ¶ Jesus therefore no longer walked about openly among the Jews, but went from there to a town called Ephraim in the region near the wilderness; and he remained there with the disciples.

John 11:55 ¶ Now the Passover of the Jews was near, and many went up from the country to Jerusalem before the Passover to purify themselves.

John 12:9 ¶ When the great crowd of the Jews learned that he was there, they came not only because of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead.

John 12:11 since it was on account of him that many of the Jews were deserting and were believing in Jesus.

John 13:33 Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, ‘Where I am going, you cannot come.’”

John 18:12 ¶ So the soldiers, their officer, and the Jewish police arrested Jesus and bound him.

John 18:14 Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jews that it was better to have one person die for the people.

John 18:20 Jesus answered, “I have spoken openly to the world; I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all the Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret.

John 18:31 Pilate said to them, “Take him yourselves and judge him according to your law.” The Jews replied, “We are not permitted to put anyone to death.”

John 18:33 ¶ Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, “Are you the King of the Jews?”

John 18:35 Pilate replied, “I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?”

John 18:36 Jesus answered, “My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here.”

John 18:38 Pilate asked him, “What is truth?” ¶ After he had said this, he went out to the Jews again and told them, “I find no case against him.

John 18:39 But you have a custom that I release someone for you at the Passover. Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?”

John 19:3 They kept coming up to him, saying, “Hail, King of the Jews!” and striking him on the face.

John 19:7 The Jews answered him, “We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has claimed to be the Son of God.”

John 19:12 From then on Pilate tried to release him, but the Jews cried out, “If you release this man, you are no friend of the emperor. Everyone who claims to be a king sets himself against the emperor.”

John 19:14 Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. He said to the Jews, “Here is your King!”

John 19:19 Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the cross. It read, “Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews.”

John 19:20 Many of the Jews read this inscription, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, in Latin, and in Greek.

John 19:21 Then the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, “Do not write, ‘The King of the Jews,’ but, ‘This man said, I am King of the Jews.’”

John 19:31 ¶ Since it was the day of Preparation, the Jews did not want the bodies left on the cross during the sabbath, especially because that sabbath was a day of great solemnity. So they asked Pilate to have the legs of the crucified men broken and the bodies removed.

John 19:38 ¶ After these things, Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, though a secret one because of his fear of the Jews, asked Pilate to let him take away the body of Jesus. Pilate gave him permission; so he came and removed his body.

John 19:40 They took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with the spices in linen cloths, according to the burial custom of the Jews.

John 19:42 And so, because it was the Jewish day of Preparation, and the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

John 20:19 ¶ When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you.”

Jesus's Preexistence in John

John 1:1 ¶ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

John 1:2 He was in the beginning with God.

John 1:3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being

John 1:14 ¶ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father’s only son, full of grace and truth.

John 1:15 (John testified to him and cried out, “This was he of whom I said, ‘He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.’”)

John 1:30 This is he of whom I said, ‘After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.’

John 3:13 No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man.

John 3:17 ¶ “Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

John 3:31 ¶ The one who comes from above is above all; the one who is of the earth belongs to the earth and speaks about earthly things. The one who comes from heaven is above all.

John 3:32 He testifies to what he has seen and heard, yet no one accepts his testimony.

John 6:33 For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.”

John 6:38 for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me.

John 6:41 ¶ Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, “I am the bread that came down from heaven.”

John 6:42 They were saying, "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?"

John 6:46 Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father.

John 6:51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

John 6:58 This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever."

John 6:62 Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before?

John 7:29 I know him, because I am from him, and he sent me."

John 8:14 Jesus answered, "Even if I testify on my own behalf, my testimony is valid because I know where I have come from and where I am going, but you do not know where I come from or where I am going.

John 8:23 He said to them, "You are from below, I am from above; you are of this world, I am not of this world.

John 8:38 I declare what I have seen in the Father's presence; as for you, you should do what you have heard from the Father."

John 8:42 Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would love me, for I came from God and now I am here. I did not come on my own, but he sent me.

John 8:58 Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, before Abraham was, I am."

John 9:39 Jesus said, "I came into this world for judgment so that those who do not see may see, and those who do see may become blind."

John 11:27 She said to him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world."

John 12:46 I have come as light into the world, so that everyone who believes in me should not remain in the darkness.

John 16:27 for the Father himself loves you, because you have loved me and have believed that I came from God.

John 16:28 I came from the Father and have come into the world; again, I am leaving the world and am going to the Father."

John 16:30 Now we know that you know all things, and do not need to have anyone question you; by this we believe that you came from God."

John 17:5 So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed.

John 17:8 for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me.

John 17:24 Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

John 20:17 Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"

Echoes of John 20:31

20:31 But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

3:15 "that whoever believes in him may have eternal life."

3:16 For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

3:36 Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever disobeys the Son will not see life, but must endure God's wrath.

5:24 "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life, and does not come under judgment, but has passed from death to life."
